MONDAY was agreed upon as the night for  
"Chess" and the hall to be the Antiquarian  
Hall, Selkirk and the time to be from  
7.30 p.m. - 10.30 p.m.

The Treasurer was approached to make the necessary  
bookings for the hall with the Secy of the  
Antiquarian Society.

Mr. H. Hogg volunteered kindly to see to the key and heating and opening up the Hall.

The Hon. Secy was asked to <sup>see to</sup> any publicity and advertising in the local Press to draw attention to the fact that there now exists a "Selkirk Chess Club".

As this was the end of the Winter Season and our weekly meetings in the Antiquarian Hall would now cease until the beginning of October (the date 11.10.1965 was decided to be the first of the 1965-66 Session) Mr. & Mrs. Leask from Ashkirk kindly offered to open their house for play during the Summer months (to keep us all in good trim). Mr. H. Hogg also kindly volunteered to provide the transport for any member who wished to go to Ashkirk. These two offers were gratefully appreciated by all members.

Mr W Hogg then took over as our new Chairman.

The minutes of our last A G M were approved. (in their absence) to be read over at a later date if desired.

It was agreed that the club would not enter the Postal Chess League this year although many members felt they had benefited by their Postal Games. The secretary was instructed to leave arrangements for a game against The Thistle Foundation until after the club resumed it's winter session in Selkirk.

Our Treasurer Mr. Hall read his report for the year. We began the year with £ 9.85 on hand and ended up with a balance of £ 4.10.11. Mr. H. Leask moved the ~~of~~ adoption of the Report. Subscriptions to remain as before. It was proposed that Players should each pay 2/6 on trips to play other teams, this would go towards the cost of petrol and any other expenses involved. Players under 14 would pay half-rate. i.e. 1/3d. <sup>men</sup> <sup>and</sup> <sup>over</sup> It was agreed that our Treasurer Mr. Hall would see Mrs Phaup re hire of the Hall at a fixed rate (£10. or less if possible.)

The purchase of another chess block was agreed and the Secretary was instructed to order it from Chess, Sutton Coldfield:

It was agreed that we should continue our membership of the Scottish Chess Association.

Mr. Hogg read a letter from the Glasgow Police Club about their Congress on Sept. 23-26th. Any player interested could enter for this. Mrs Leask <sup>mentioned</sup> announced that the Scottish Chess Congress for 1967/68 would be held at Ayr from July 6-13th.

Mr. Hogg read a letter from Mr. Partridge Glasgow, re a Regional Chess Competition. Mr.

Leask had agreed to be the <sup>main</sup> leader for the Border Region. Mr. Hogg agreed to attend a meeting in Glasgow on 19th Sept. The agenda for this meeting was discussed at some length and Mr. Hogg noted the club's views on all relevant matters.

It was agreed that we should change the name of our club to the Border Chess Club (Selkirk) as we know of no other clubs in the Borders.

The Secretary was asked to write to the Town clerks of Kelso, Duns, Peebles, Jedburgh and Melrose to find out if there was any chess clubs or interest in chess in these towns.

Mrs Hogg asked about the possibility of some  
such Instruction being given at our meetings. ~~It~~  
~~was agreed by~~ Mr. Leask <sup>suggested</sup> that this should take  
the form of a discussion on one "opening" at a  
time during the first 15 mins each evening and  
this was agreed by all - after much discussion  
on the subject. Mrs Hogg thanked Mr & Mrs  
Leask for their hospitality to club members during  
the summer months. The meeting ended with  
tea & biscuits.

Our first fixture will be against Glasgow South and Mr Hogg agreed to get in touch with them and try to arrange the date of our game for Sat. Nov. 9th in Edinburgh. He would also get in touch with the Edinburgh club and find out if their premises would be available then. The game to be played in the afternoon between 2-6-pm approx. The team to be as follows W. Leithhead, I. Bogle, H. Leask, M. Leask, J. Clarke, A. Hall, G. Thomson, J. McPartlin. If needed we would call on W. Hogg, A. Miles or I. Garner.

Mr Leask suggested that we in the Borders Chess Club should approach Mrs Stewart, Rector of the High School, about the possibility of starting up the Selkirk High School Chess Club again. All members were in agreement and offered to help with the coaching of the School pupils if this could be arranged for

a Monday night. The possibility of the Border Club meeting in the School, at a later date, to be gone into by Mr. Leask, and reported on later.

Two new members were welcomed by Mrs. W. Hogg, they were Ian Cockburn and Norman Fallock. The matter of subs. for the members still at School was discussed and it was agreed that they should pay 1/- per night - but no <sup>ann.</sup> Subscription.

It was agreed that as the numbers in the club were so small no other committee members need be appointed.

The treasurer's report was read and approved. It showed that we had a <sup>credit</sup> balance of £4:10:11 at the beginning of the year and ended up with 11/2d. A chess clock had been purchased during the year and other expenses <sup>included those</sup> ~~was~~ incurred by the Regional Chess Competition and hire of the Hall.

It was decided to keep Subscriptions at £1. for all adult members, plus 1/- nightly for all members. After a good deal of discussion it was agreed that we should not ask the members of our club who are still at School to pay any yearly subscription.

We agreed that the club would continue to meet in Selkirk on Monday evenings as before. The Secretary was instructed to write to Mrs. Phaup and try to arrange for the rent of the Antiquarian Hall to be at a fixed rate as low as possible (£9 or £10) pointing out to Mrs Phaup our lower membership for this year.

We decided not to enter the Regional Chess Competition this year - due to lack of numbers. It was agreed that we would renew our membership of the Scottish Chess Assoc. If numbers permit we would take part in the Spens Cup Competition. Mr. J. Clarke agreed to play for us, if ~~any~~ needed on any matches in Edinburgh.

The Secretary was asked to write to Mrs. Stewart (Secretary of the Yellane Chess Club) and try to fix up a friendly match as soon as possible, a Saturday or Sunday afternoon if possible.

Mr Leask agreed to make Recruitment Posters which would be put up in Gala, Hawick and Selkirk in September. also Earlston?

Mr Leask asked the members of the Chess Club if, in the event of a Primary School League being formed in the Border Areas, any members would be willing to assist officiate on a Saturday morning or on a weekday after 4pm. Mrs Thomson & Mr Hall expressed willingness to help if required.

It was agreed that there should be a time-limit for the completion of all Competition Games. This was fixed as the last club night in March each year. Championship competition and Knock-out Competition (Handicap) to run concurrently. It was proposed by Mr Clarke that the Tournament Director should arrange for competition games each night, this was seconded by Mr Hogg.

Results of ~~the~~ last year's Championship Competition were decided on the games played. Mrs Leask had the most points 10½ out of 12. Mr Hogg called on Mrs Thomson to present the Trophy to Mrs Leask. Mrs Leask agreed to have

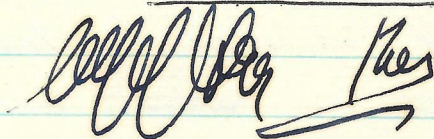
The time ~~limit~~ <sup>rate</sup> for games played in our club championships was fixed at 25 moves per hour, unless otherwise agreed between any two players.
